results, in the formation of Congregations in Galt and Stratford. At the end of this quarter, the list of probationers was very much reduced. Mr Baird received and accepted a call from Erskine and Claremont Churches, Pickering; Mr Clark requested his name to be withdrawn from the list of preachers; Mr William Inglis accepted a call from Westminster Congregation; Mr Walter Inglis was called to Greenock, in the Presbytery of Grey, and accepted said call; Mr. Stevenson was called to, and was settled in, Stratford, in the Brant Presbytery; and Mr Walker was called to Chatham, in the London Presbytery-leaving only three preachers on the list, during the quarter from April to June, to supply twenty-seven vacancies.

The Committee have also to report that the Rev. Messrs. Thornton, Kennedy, Jennings, and Young gave, each of them, two Sabbaths' supply to the stations within the bounds of the Grey and London Presbyteries.

The Committee would respectfully suggest to the Synod, that some effort be put forth to obtain from the parent Church in Scotland additional preachers, to supply our continually increasing vacancies, and especially because the members of Presbyteries having each one or two Congregations of their own to supply, cannot give the vacancies the service which they require.
