**By-Law No. 567**

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF RE-
GINA TO PROVIDE FOR THE
CLOSING OF CERTAIN SHOPS OF
THE SAID CITY AT A CERTAIN
HOUR.

The Council of the City of Regina
enacts as follows:

1. in this bylaw "Holiday" shall
have the same meaning as such ex-
pression is given by "The Interpre-
tation Act," and also includes any
civil holiday so proclaimed.

2. Except on Saturday, and on any
day immediately preceding a holiday
and for one week prior to Christmas
Day, all shops in the City of Regina
belonging to any of the
classes, namely Dry Goods, Gents' Furnishings,
Gents' Clothing, Boots and
Shoes, Groceries, Furs and Caps,
House Furnishings, Trunks and Val-
uables, Millinery, Ladies' Clothing,
Hardware, Butchers, Furniture, Hos-
pitality, shall upon the going into force
of this bylaw, be closed each day at
the hour of seven o'clock in the after-
noon and remain closed until the
hour of five o'clock in the forenoon of
the next following day.

PROVIDED that on Saturday and
on any day immediately preceding a
holiday and for one week prior to
Christmas Day, all shops in the City of Regina
belonging to any of the
classes above mentioned shall be
closed each day at the hour of ten
o'clock in the afternoon and shall re-
main closed until the hour of five
o'clock in the forenoon of the next
following day.

Nothing in this bylaw shall be
deemed to render unlawful the con-
tinuance in shop after the hour or
hours appointed for the closing
thereof of any customers who
were in the shop immediately before
that hour or hours or their serving of
such customers during their continu-
ance therein.

Nothing in this bylaw contained
shall render the occupier of any pre-
mises to which this bylaw relates
liable to any fine, penalty or punish-
ment for supplying any article re-
quired for immediate use by reason
or cause of any emergency arising
from sickness, ailment or death; but
nothing herein contained shall be
deemed to authorize any person whomsoever to keep open such shop
after the hour or hours appointed for
the closing of the bylaw for the closing of the
same.

Any person convicted of any
breach of any of the provisions of this
bylaw shall forfeit and pay at the dis-
cretion of the convicting Police Mag-
istrate or Justice of the Peace having
jurisdiction in the City of Regina, a
penalty not exceeding One Hundred
Dollars (\$100.00) exclusive of costs
for each offence, and upon default of
payment, the person convicted may be
committed to jail or to the guard-
room of the Royal North-West Mount-
ain Police Force or to any public
lockup for any time determined by
the said Police Magistrate or Justice,
not exceeding thirty days, with or
without hard labor, unless such pen-
alty and costs, including the costs of
the committal and of the conveyance
of the person convicted to the said
jail, guard-room or lockup are sooner
paid.

This bylaw shall take effect on
the 31st day of October, 1910, and
the same shall be published in the
"Daily Standard," and the "Morning
Leader," and "Saskatchewan Cour-
ter," newspapers published in the
City of Regina, in at least two issues of
the said papers respectively, such
publications to be made before this
bylaw takes effect.
