
**STEAMER BENDU SAILS**

**CAPTAIN HALL RECEIVES CANE**  
Captain John Hall of the Allan Line steamer Corsican, has the honor of first reaching Montreal this season. The commanders of the steamers who leave the other side for the St. Lawrence via each other to be the first to open the summer trade, as well to receive the gold-headed cane which the harbor commissioners present to the lucky commander. On Friday, Captain Hall was presented with the cane. Having left Quebec on Wednesday afternoon, the Corsican had a good lead on her competitors, the Allan Line Ionian and Donaldson Line S. S. Saturnia. The Ionian and Saturnia left Quebec at three and four o'clock Thursday morning. The Saturnia won second place by a few minutes. The steamships had good passages across. Altogether the steamers brought out 592 cabin and 1,134 steerage passengers.

(Reported to the Hydrographic office) New York, May 3—Steamer Sloterdijk (Dutch), reports April 30: April 29, 09 N, lon 39 32 W, passed a beam about twenty feet long and one foot square.  
The Canadian signal service, under date of April 27, reported ice as follows: Point Bacunac, light close packed ice inshore; Grindstone, about four miles loose ice inshore on north side; Grosse Isle, light close packed ice inshore two miles wide, moving east; Scatar, heavy open ice; Belle Isle, heavy close packed ice everywhere, fourteen bergs.  
Steamer Stanley reports: Loose ice extends six miles off east side of St. Paul's Island. No ice between this and Cape Ray. Light scattered ice extends from St. Paul's Island toward the northwest, which is the end of the Gulf pack.  
Report from revenue cutter Miami, ice patrol vessel, April 30: April 29, field ice, numerous bergs and growlers, extend south to lat 42 50, lon 49 20. Have advised steamers to keep south of 42 parallel as far as 47th meridian.
