Cunard Liner Flies Neutral Flag While Clearing Irish Sea

Passengers Say the Orduna Flew the Stars and Stripes for 24 Hours—Captain Has Orders From Admiralty Not to Discuss Matter.

New York, Feb. 10.—Officials of the Cunard Steamship Company admitted tonight that the steamer Orduna, which arrived in this port from Liverpool today, flew a neutral flag, for a time, while she was clearing the Irish coast.

TALK OF GERMAN INVASION OF CANADA ALL MOONSHINE, EX-PRES. TAFT SAYS

Toronto, Feb. 10.—Former President W. H. Taft, arrived here today for a stay of two days, during which he will deliver several lectures and addresses.

FOUND SENTIMENT IN NEW ORLEANS IN FAVOR OF ALLIES

Toronto, Feb. 10.—Hon. Mr. Justice Riddell, who represented the Province of Ontario at the recent celebration of the hundredth anniversary of the Battle of New Orleans, and of One Hundred Years of Peace, which took place in the City of New Orleans last month, in the course of a report to the Ontario government, states that in the city, the British and American flags were displayed everywhere, and the strongest feeling of friendship towards Canada and the Empire was evident.

RAILWAYS HELP IN PRESERVATION OF FORESTS.

The Canadian Forestry Association has just expressed to the railways its appreciation of the assistance rendered to the Ontario government, in a letter to Mr. G. T. Bell, Passenger Traffic Manager of the Grand Trunk System, the Secretary, Mr. James Lawler, says that but for the help so freely given the work of the association in promoting forest protection would have been greatly curtailed.

TO SEND CARGO OF WILHELMINA TO PRIZE COURT

British Foreign Office decides—Steamer may leave Falmouth as soon as cargo discharged.

London, Feb. 10, 6:55 p. m.—The British Foreign Office, after an inquiry, has decided that the cargo of the American steamer Wilhelmina must go through a prize court.

WASHINGTON WILL WAIT UNTIL CARGO GOES INTO PRIZE COURT.

Washington, Feb. 10.—The State Department will take no action in the case of the Wilhelmina, unless the ship's cargo is taken before a prize court, which will determine its exact character and liability to confiscation.

ATTACK BY GERMAN SUBMARINE ON SHIP CARRYING REFUGEES

French Govt. makes report on torpedoing of merchant ship carrying women and children.

Paris, Feb. 10.—The French government today made public the result of the inquiry ordered by the Minister of Marine into the torpedoing of the French merchantman Amiral Ganteaume on October 26, 1914, and gave representatives in Paris of the neutral powers copies of the memorandum.

CASHIER WINS IN PISTOL DUEL WITH TWO BANK ROBBERS

Cincinnati, Ohio, Feb. 10.—A pistol battle between Cashier William Cross of the Mohawk German Banking and Savings Company, of this city, and two men who attempted to rob the bank today resulted in the death of one of the robbers. Cross was uninjured although the robbers first fired when within a foot of him when he made a grab for his pistol after being ordered by the bandits to throw up his hands.

MARRIAGE BY PROXY FOR FRENCH SOLDIERS NOW AT THE FRONT

Paris, Feb. 10.—Minister of Justice Briand, with the approval of M. Millerand, the Minister of War, has given his approval to the proposed bill which would allow soldiers who are unable to leave the front to contract marriages by proxy.
