## SWIMMING CLASSES

TO OPEN AT Y. M. C. A.

The boys who have wished to learn the art of swimming have now their opportunity in the free swimming campaign which is being held under the auspices of the Y. M. C. A. commencing today and continuing through Friday. The free swimming campaign has been an annual feature for the last two years and fine results have been obtained. During the first year's campaign 118 boys enrolled, and out of these 66 boys were taught to be at home in the water. Last year 79 boys were taught to swim out of a total enrollment of 139 boys. H. O. Bonk, physical director of the Y. M. C. A., who is in charge of the campaign, expects an unusually large enrollment this year and is planning accordingly.

The campaign is for the benefit of boys of 12 years of age and over, and sessions will be held in the afternoon from 4:30 to 6 o'clock, and in the evenings from 7:30 to 8:30. All the latest strokes will be taught, and each boy will be made to feel perfectly at home in the water by the time the course of instruction is over. As this course is free to every boy in the city it is hoped by the Y. M. C. A. officials that the attendance will be large.

The men's class in swimming will follow next week from the 5th to the 8th of June inclusive.
