McKenzie put up a good performance,
the lightweight, however, being far
superior all through. He displayed
wonderful speed and hit his opponent
at ease.
Harding, the bantam champion,
fought two rounds with cadet Rutherford,
and two with cadet Forman,
easily winning both from his men.
Eight bouts were staged in the R.
M. C. I. competition, and all were very
closely contested with Captain H.
Kingsley, of the Royal Naval College,
being, perhaps, the best boxer of the
day.
