C.G.M.M. Will Not
Have A Deficit

Officials Declare Surprise is
Due Country When Figures
Are Announced.

Ottawa, March 28.—A knockout
announcement was made today
by the Canadian government
officials. Such is the official
version of the department of
commerce. The department
has placed the merchant
marine's trial balance in the
light of the National Rail-
way, but the answer received by
the department from today when the
question was asked the department, was:
"There's a great disappointment
awaiting those who have predicted a
deficit."

Beyond this, nothing is ventured,
although from semi-official sources
the optimistic statement is made that
a substantial margin on the right side
of the ledger will be announced in
the house by Hon. C. O. Balguyne
this week.

St. Lawrence Free
of Winter's Ice

From Montreal to the Ocean
River Ice Has Broken Away
at Record Early Opening.

Montreal, March 28.—The final
break-up of ice in the River St. Lawrence
took place overnight and the
river was declared clear this morning.
The report that the last ice barrier
between Quebec and Montreal had
broken away last night. When the
breaker Lady Gray left Three Rivers
at 8:45 a. m. today and is due here
this afternoon. When she arrives she
will have broken all official records
of forty years, including the previous
record of 1910, when the ice
passed out on April 5.

Last year the Lady Gray had to
buck the heaviest ice she had ever
encountered for over ten days before
reaching Montreal on April 15. By the
average for the last decade, the river
has opened up about a month earlier
this year. Many freighters in Britain
will in the course of the next week
have their original route to the Atlantic
seaports changed to Montreal and
the prospects are at present that the
first arrival here from the sea will
also establish a port record.
