PARISH AND DIOCESAN NOTES.

This number will complete one year of the Parish Magazine, and this will be the last number, at any rate, for a while. Financially, the venture has not been altogether a success. Thus far, sixty-five have paid for the Magazine bringing in \$32.50. The cost has been for one hundred copies for one year \$41.40, leaving a balance on the wrong side of nearly nine dollars. We think the circulation of such a little paper every month is a good idea; it gives a knowledge of what is going on in work of the Church. We may start the Magazine again, or something like it, in the future, but it will have to be on a more satisfactory

Good progress is being made with the Ottawa Episcopal Endowment Fund. Mr. Hannington is meeting with success in his canvass, and we hope before another year elapses to have a bishop in the Metropolis of the Dominion.

THE Rev. Canon Pettit, who, for over twenty years, was Rector of Richmond, and who is still most affectionately remembered, has just resigned the parish of Cornwall, owing to ill health. We hope that entire rest may lead to his recovery, and we are sure that every one of his old parishioners will sympathize with him in his affliction.

THE total amount contributed by this parish, for the Diocesan Mission Fund during the year, was \$132.73, as against \$100 for last year.
