HESSON, SAMUEL ROLLIN, *J.P.* (*North Perth*).

Parents born in Ireland; came to Can. in 1832. B. in the Co. Antrim, Irel., 25 Sept. 1829. Ed. at Dundas, Ont., Grammar School. M., 21 Nov. 1855, at Simcoe, Ont., Miss M. J., eldest dau. of John Polley, Esq., founder of Simcoe. Is a merchant. Was Postmaster of Sebringville for seven years. Apptd. J.P. for the Co. of Perth in 1857. Was repeatedly elected as Town Councillor of Stratford by acclamation, and was Mayor of that town in 1875. Is a dir. of the Stratford Gas Co., and Chairman of the Stratford, Lake Huron, and Georgian Bay Railway Trust Board. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1878, and re-elected at g.e. 1882 and at g.e. 1887. A Conservative, strongly impressed with the advantage of a Protective and National Policy to the young Dominion.—*Stratford, Ont.*

HICKEY, CHARLES ERASTUS, *B.A., M.D., C.M.* (*Dundas*.)

Fifth s. of Major John Hickey, of Williamsburg, Ont., a descendant of a U. E. Loyalist, who, after the Am. Revolution, settled on the farm still owned and held by the family. B. at Williamsburg, 24 March, 1840. Ed. at Victoria Univ., Cobourg, and McGill Univ., Montreal. Graduated in Arts at the former, May 1863, and in Medicine at the latter, May 1866. Was Valedictorian of the class. M., 18 Sept., 1873, Mary Elizabeth, sister of Dr. W. George Beers, of Montreal. Was Inspector of Common Schools for the Tp. of Winchester for two years, and an Examiner of Common School Teachers, for Co. Dundas for two years. First returned to Parlt. at g.e. 1882, and re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative, and a thorough Canadian in fact and in policy.—*Morrisburg, Ont.*

HOLTON, EDWARD, *B.C.L.* (*Chateauguay*.)

Only surviving s. of the late Hon. L. H. Holton, who represented Chateauguay in the Commons from the Union until his death, March 1880. B. at Montreal, Sept. 1844. Ed. a private schools and McGill Univ. Called to the Bar of Quebec, June 1867. M., Oct. 1873, Helen, dau. of Mr. William Ford, of Kingston, Ont. Returned to Parlt. upon the death of his father, April 1880. Re-elected at
