

trear after a previous visitation, examination and estimation of the premises shall have been made by *Experts* to be named by the parties respectively, and in default of such nomination by them, or either of them, then by the said Court, in manner and form prescribed by law; and the said Court is hereby authorized and empowered to hear, settle and finally determine the amount of such compensation in consequence; Provided always, that the said Alexander Maurice Delisle, Benjamin Henri Lemoine, and Jean Baptiste Debien, their heirs, executors, curators and assigns, shall not commence the erection of the said Bridge and other works by which any person may be deprived of his land or part thereof, or may suffer damage, before the price or value of the said land and damages, estimated and settled in manner before prescribed, shall have been paid to such person, or such price or value shall have been offered to him, and that on his refusal thereof the said Alexander Maurice Delisle, Benjamin Henri Lemoine, and Jean Baptiste Debien, shall have deposited it at the office of the Prothonotary of the Court of Queen's Bench for the said District of Montreal.

III. And whereas it may be necessary for the purpose of effecting a communication with the said Bridge, to change the direction of the Queen's highway in the vicinity thereof, or to open a new highway or highways: Be it therefore enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Deputy Grand Voyer for the County of Terrebonne, or other officer or person performing the duties formerly assigned to the Grand Voyer, to send an order to the Surveyor of highways, or the officer or other person performing the duties of the office of Surveyor of highways in every Parish through which the said Queen's highway or highways may pass, to be by him read and published in the usual manner at the Church door of every such Parish, in
