

cant shall himself, with two other sufficient sureties, enter into bond in the sum of three hundred pounds currency, for the faithful discharge of his duties, (which bond shall be taken before the Chairman of the Board of Trade, if there be one, if not before the Mayor of the City,) and shall also, before any of the Justices of the Queen's Bench, take and subscribe the following oath, that is to say:

"I, A. B. do solemnly swear, that I will faithfully, truly and impartially, to the best of my skill and understanding, execute, do and perform, the duty of a Culler and Measurer of—(Here insert the description of the lumber of which he is to be a Culler and Measurer) according to the true intent and meaning of an Act, intituled, *'An Act to regulate the Inspection and Measurement of Timber, Masts, Spars, Deals, Staves, and other articles of a like nature, in the Ports of Quebec and Montreal, and for other purposes relative to the same;*' and that I will give a true and faithful account and certificate of the number, quality and dimensions or measurement, of the lumber of which I am commissioned to be a Culler, which may be submitted to my judgment and inspection, according to the best of my knowledge; and that I will not directly or indirectly be a dealer in, or interested in the buying or selling of any article of lumber, either on my own account, or on account of any other person or persons whatsoever; and that I will not at any
