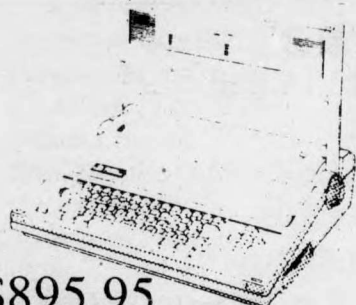
A special thanks goes to our coaches Peter Wiggins and Donny Breen for whipping us into shape in record time.

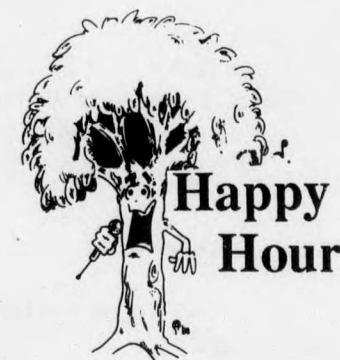
