Health

The health of the Station was reasonably good during March. There were of course a number in hospital from colds, and a large number of Tonsillectomies and Submucous Resection operations were performed by S/L J. C. Armit (C.8280) (Med.), of the Medical Selection Board.

Spiritual Welfare

The Station Chaplain has proven himself keenly interested in the spiritual welfare of all ranks. An effort has been made to frequently include W.E.T.P. personnel in Church Parades. The Chaplain has also stimulated considerable interest in the Station Library and many new books have been added.

Study Facilities

F/O D. A. Prescott (C.20792) (Educ.) assumed duties as Unit Education Officer and has been given supervision over a new Study Room which has been set up in the Normal School building. Excellent progress has been made in this respect.

Discipline

A high standard of discipline has been maintained and few cases require the attention of the Commanding Officer.

Sports and Recreation

Station Teams did not seem to win out in the finals, but a keen interest has been taken in sports, with events of some kind held nearly every night. The new canteen building is nearing completion and changes from it will greatly enlarge the scope of the Auxiliary Services Officer. Another successful Station Dance was held in the Drill Hall with the 12-piece Station Orchestra in attendance.

Leadership Training

The Cadet system, so successfully experimented with in the graduate squadron, has been extended to current courses with gratifying results. The trainees have been much intrigued and have taken up their new responsibilities in a grand way.

Esprit de Corps

This can probably best be reflected by the Red Cross Campaign. Last year about \$1,445.00 was raised. This year the Commanding Officer "sold" the Station on raising \$2,000.00, which would mean about \$2.00 each. The final total was \$2,234.73, and all ranks were very proud of the showing made.
