Dear Col.Hanbury-Filliame:

Before leaving Ottawa, I intended to suggest to you that in the event of Washington being asked to send official representatives to the tercentenary celebration at Quebec. there is no one who, in some respects, sight be a better person to have interested in the celebration than Golomel John J.NoCook of New York.
