with a headline - '' Mackenzie King cites ten Benefits from the Ottawa Conference '' and said very little about the rest of your speech .

From p 38 on to the end , p 67, I have nothing but admiration for the manner in which you have dealt with ways and means of promoting inter-empire and international trade. The opposing points of view of the two major parties are put in striking contrast, and the whole treatment of the subject is effective and convincing. If you propose to deal with the Conference at any length in South Huron, this is the portion of your speech that I think is best adapted for the purpose.

When in Ottawa, I sent you two brief memoranda, one on the Imperial Conference as an issue in South Huron, and the other on Proportional Representation and the Alternative Vote. I note from this morning's paper that the third candidate, Mr. Cooper, has now withdrawn.

My very best wishes for success in your speeches. I know they will go splendidly .
