To all Members of Parliament in the British Dominions,
Members of League of Nations Societies, and all men and women
interested in furthering peace:-

The Toronto Branch of the League of Nations Society in Canada
and the Women's League of Nations Association desire to call
your attention to the enclosed pamphlets, "Enemies of Peace",
and "Salesmen of Death", written by Colonel George A. Drew of
Toronto.

The control of armament manufacture is the first step toward
disarmament. Little has yet been done to carry into effect the
conclusions of the Commission of the League of Nations, the re-
port of which was published in 1921. The present world-situation
makes this a crucial moment, if public opinion is to make itself
heard. Will you not use your influence to have the representa-
tives of your Government at the Council or Assembly of the League
of Nations at Geneva instructed to insist on the abolition of
private manufacture of certain types of armament, or at least
on very strict government control. If you are a member of any
Society will you not try to have a resolution passed and sent to
your Member of Parliament, similar to the one enclosed, which was
unanimously passed at the great meeting in the Royal York Hotel
on February 14th, 1933. Will you not also protest to your Prime
Minister, Senators and Members of Parliament against the adjourn-
ment of the Disarmament Conference without substantial reduction
in arms.
