

date was written under a misappre-
 hension, and you were informed of
 this in the letter of the 3rd February
 1878. The misapprehension was
 caused by wrong information given
 by you in your letter of the 10th Decr.
 1874, viz that the logs cut were as
 cut with the object of disposing of
 them. Moreover, the law has been
 changed in the above respect since
 the date of the correspondence
 which took place in 1874 and
 1878. It is true that, as stated by
 you, subsection 9 of section 10 of
 the Act 47 Vic. Cap. 28 does give
 the Chief authority to pass a by-
 law for the protection of the wood
 upon their Reserve; but that Act
 (the Indian Advancement Act) must
 be applied by the Governor General
