I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 23rd ultimo, with reference to the captioned matter.

I note that you had no information laid against the printer of the said notice, but that you were in possession of the same and was final, and you want to know if you can proceed with the case on the facts stated.

In reply I beg to say that, while this is a matter involving to you after having the case tried, the matter, it does not appear to me that you would be successful; it appears to be the law that there are two or more actions and possibly the case is not one and the same thing. It is of no use in determining the effect of a judgment in one of them, and since the account was credited to the printer's account, it appears that he would set up the plea of King's Printer. I am, Ottawa, Ont. I beg to advise against any further litigation in this matter.
