
Ottawa, 7th April, 1919.

Sir:-

With reference to your letter of the 31st March in which you made report relative to the proposal of the Mississauga Council of the Credit to offer a reward for the arrest and conviction of the person or persons guilty of destroying the fence on the property of Mr. A.A.King; I beg to say that the Department approves of a reward being offered, but considers it should be limited to \$25.00 or \$50.00. You should inform the Indians to this effect and also say to them that the Department considers it injudicious to make payment in excess of \$50.00 from Band funds for the purpose mentioned. You may advertise as proposed, limiting the expenditure as stated.
