

Dear Sir,-

Chief Peter Isaac called at the Department yesterday and stated that three of his sons had enlisted for Overseas service. One, Peter Isaac, No. 270138, enlisted with the 215th Battalion, is now married and has a family of his own. Another, Frank, was killed Overseas, and the third, Hubert has had his leg amputated as a result of his service Overseas. The one remaining son, Archie, has been in the States for some time.

Peter Isaac explains that he has depended, to a certain extent at least, on his sons for his support and wishes to know if he is not eligible for pension. Before taking the matter up with the Board of Pension Commissioners I would like to have your opinion, and I would ask you to let me have a report on the case at your convenience. You might let me have the regimental number of these boys when you make your report.
