the King paid a special tribute to the well-established loyalty of the French Canadian people and added the following message: "The spirit of tolerance in which the two great races dwell side by side in this Province is an example to the entire world. This harmony augurs well for the future of Canada."

Mayor Lucien Borne of Quebec also presented to
His Majesty an address of welcome on behalf of the oldest
city in Canada. According to the protocol of the royal
tour, the latter was not read, but merely handed to the King.

After the reception of addresses, the King and Queen stepped down to the floor of the chamber. The Premier presented to Their Majesties, His Eminence Cardinal Villeneuve, the members of the Legislative Assembly and their wives and the high officials of the Provincial Government and their wives. Mayor Borne presented the members of the City Council of Quebec.

When the King and the Queen walked out of the Chamber, the whole assembly broke spontaneously into warm applause. A short drive brought Their Majesties to the old Citadel, where Boy Scouts and Girl Guides formed a cheering cordon along the winding cobble-stone road of the fortress. From the flagpole of the highest bastion, the
