## PREFACE.

The following Sermon was taken down by a reporter, and is now printed as corrected by the preacher.

He cannot easily forget the impressive spectacle which he witnessed in the parish Church of Crathie, when the greatest Sovereign of the greatest nation upon earth, surrounded by the highest and the very humblest of her subjects, joined together in the worship of Him, by whom kings reign, and princes decree justice, and with whom there is no respect of persons. Amid the magnificent scenery of Dee-side, not the least significent was that assembly of worshippers.

Such a spectacle is in itself a joyous prophecy. It cannot increase, but it must consecrate, the deep and enthusiastic loyalty and love of Her Majesty's subjects.
