STRATFORDVILLE.

A post village situated in the Township of Bayham at the intersection of the Talbot Street with the Ingersoll and Port Burwell Stage Road, distant from Port Burwell 8 miles; 24 miles from Ingersoll; 30 miles from Simcoe, and 23 miles from St. Thomas, the county town. It contains one church, the Methodist Episcopal, a frame building, a good school house, Ed. Gray's steam saw mill, capable of cutting half a million feet of lumber annually, he uses a 25 horse-power engine, and employs 4 hands; 2 hotels; 1 general store, 1 grocery, 1 waggon shop and 2 blacksmith shops, 1 harness and 1 boot and shoe shop. Mails daily each way. Population 50.
