QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS. Miscellaneous.

HEAVES.

I have a mare, 8 years old, which had distemper last fall. They used a blister on her. All the swellings disappeared without showing any abscess. She had distemper at the age of five years. I put her on pasture the part of the summer. When at work or on the road we soon hear her roaring. Is there any danger of heaves or of any other diseases? Is it curable? What shall I do?

Ans.—The influenza or distemper has affected her system generally, and especially the respiratory organs. The lungs became weakened and heaves have developed. There is no cure, but the symptoms can be relieved by careful feeding. Feed in small quantities of firstclass hay and increase the grain ration. Dampen everything eaten by her with lime water. Avoid working or driving shortly after a meal, and be careful not to allow her to overload her stomach at any time.

WALL CONSTRUCTION-BARN PLAN.

1. Is there any advantage or disadvantages of a cement and gravel wall over a stone and lime wall for a stable basement under a barn, in points of economy, durability, strength and warmth. Gravel, sand, stone, lime and cement close at hand.

2. Have you any good plans for a bank barn 40 x 60 feet, for a 50-acre farm, handling stock and grain or gen-J. H. S. eral farming.

Ans.-1. The general opinion of those who are situated as indicated in the question is that the cement wall is the cheaper of the two, and if properly built it is the most economical. Of course poor walls of either material may be constructed. The durability depends largely upon material used in construction and the kind of workmanship, but if the best possible cement is used and proper mixing done we believe that it will in the end prove more durable than stone. There should be little difference in the actual strength of the two walls, provided they were equally well built. warmth the cement wall built as a hollow wall would be the warmer; built solid, a twelve-inch cement wall would probably not keep out so much cold as an eighteen-inch stone wall. It should be remembered that in constructing the wall, if of cement, the owner can do much of the work himself, whereas with stone a mason is required.

2. It should be possible to obtain plans from your carpenter or contractor. It might be profitable for you to visit a few farms of the size indicated and see the barns for yourself.

FITTING FOR SHOW-ABORTION CLYDESDALE PEDIGREE.

1. Have a mare or filly which being let run on pasture all summer and allowed ut till November has developed quite a coat of hair. Is it possible to shorten it by blanketing, so as to be able to show her at the winter shows? How could she be prepared?

Ans.-1. Blanketing and stabling in a warm stable will doubtless aid in shortening her coat and making it glossy and sleek. Give her regular exercise and regular and thorough cleaning. Feed her ilberally upon good oats and hay and a
