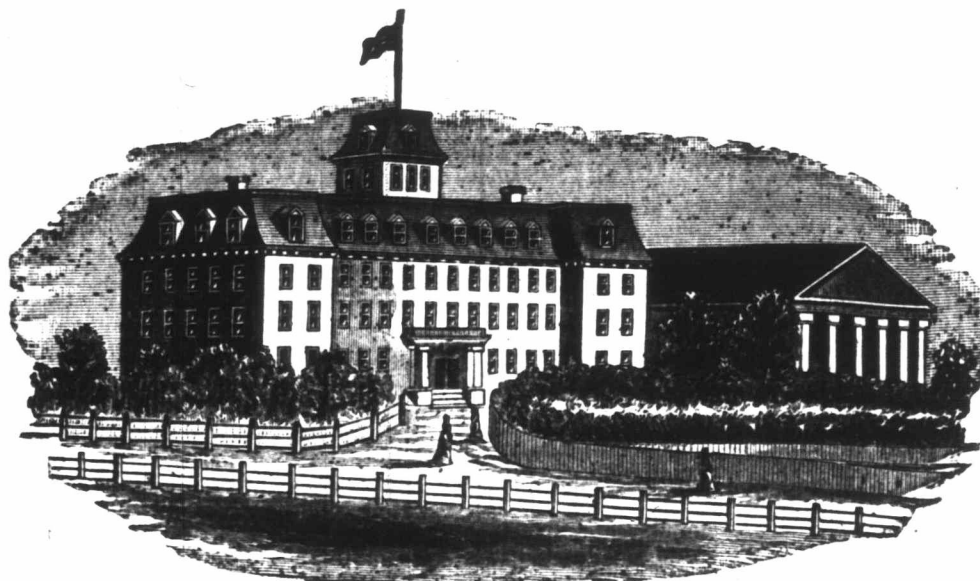
At Westworth, July 31st, Edie E., daughter of Anassa and Sarah J. Betts, aged seven years and one month.
