An Act for appropriating certain Monies for defraying the expences of

the Province.

And an Act for granting certain Sums for repairing and laying out Roads.

And then His Excellency was pleased to make the following Speech to both Houses, viz.—

" Gentlemen of the Council,

" And Gentlemen of the Assembly,

"HE business before you being now completed, I avail myself of the occasion to express the satisfaction afforded me by the harmony with which your proceedings have been conducted; and from which I anticipate the future prevalence of that spirit of moderation in our public Councils, which is of such importance to the public welfare.

"You have formerly declared your concurrent resolution to be governed, in all your deliberations, by the rules of Parliamentary proceeding; and I trust, that you will ere long, surmount every difficulty which may have flood in the way of your carrying this wise and loyal resolution into complete effect."

After which the Clerk of the Crown, by His Excellency's command, said—
"It is His Excellency's will and pleasure, that this GENERAL ASSEMBLY be
"prorogued to the First Tuesday in June next; and the same is hereby
"prorogued accordingly.
