Esquire, Clerk of the Commons House of Assembly, the sum of One hundred and four pounds, nine shillings and one penny, in order to enable him to answer and satisfy the Contingent expenses of the Commons House of Assembly, including the wages of extra Copying Clerks during the present Session; and also Your Excellency's Warrant to the Receiver General, requiring him to pay the sum of Thirty pounds to enable him to purchase a supply of stationery for the use of the ensuing Session of Parliament, which several sums of money the Commons will make good to Your Excellency the next Session of Parliament. Then, on motion of Captain Cowan, seconded by Captain Elliott, Ordered, That the said Address be now engrossed.

The said Address as engrossed was then read, which passed, and was signed by Mr. Speaker.

On motion of Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Weekes,

Ordered, That Captain Cowan and Mr. McGregor do present the said Address to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor.

On motion of Mr. Howard, seconded by Mr. Crysler, the House adjourned.

## Saturday, 2nd March, 1805.

Prayers were read.

Captain Cowan and Mr. McGregor reported that in obedience to the Order of the House they had waited upon His Excellency, the Lieutenant Governor, and presented to him the Address of this House voted yesterday.

To which His Excellency was pleased to return the following answer: Gentlemen,

I accede to the Address of the House of Assembly of the 1st of March, 1805, and shall issue my Warrants accordingly. York, 2nd March, 1805.

Accordingly Mr. Speaker with the House went up to attend His Excellency, when His Excellency was pleased to give in His Majesty's name the Royal assent to the following Public and Private Bills:

An Act to alter certain parts of An Act passed in the Forty-second year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in the District of Newcastle."

An Act to make Provision for Further Appointments of Parish and Town Officers throughout this Province.

An Act for the Relief of Insolvent Debtors.

An Act to regulate the Curing, Packing and Inspection of Beef and Pork.
