THE SITUATION.

## "Completely successful." is the description of General Haig with regard to the latest British drive east of Ypres. The advance has been over a front of eight miles and they now have possession of just about all of the Ridge for the domination of the Plains of Flanders. The number of prisoners taken is thus far over three thousand. That the British should not only be able to repulse counter-attacks, but also at the same time to make headway is an elo quent evidence of the manner in which the initiative on the Western front has shifted.

In addition to proving the eyes for the combative forces aeroplanes are more and more accomplishing direct offensive work. Tons of explosives have been dropped by the allied machines on military points, and the word is manifestly also soon to be uttered for them to make reprisals in answer to the murderous visits of German machines to the Old Land. In Washington yesterday Secretary of War Baker made the official announcement that twenty thousand planes were now in process of manufacture, and also the necessary motors and machine guns with which they will be out fitted. All kinds are included in the program, from the light high speed type to powerful bombing and battle planes of heavy design. That in addition to scouting and observation purposes, aeroplanes are going to take more and more of a share in actual hostilities is becoming each day clearly apparent. Meanwhile the handling of the submarine menace would seem to be getting much better in hand and a high official of the British Admiralty is responsible for the statement that more German undersea craft have been sunk during the past

three months than during any simfiar period.
