Whitmore one of the most expert minerologists of that state. Mr. Heinze is heavily interested in a financial way in the proposed Alaskan Central Railway which will in the near future construct a line from Valdez to Eagle. Mr. Heinze is president of the United Copper Company which is capitalized at \$80,000,000, one of the greatest of Montana's many wealthy syndicates. Mr. Heinze is yet on the sunny side of forty and his fortune has come to him through his own efforts, he having started in Montana years ago as a mining engineer. At one time he was in the employ of W. A. Clark, another copper magnate whose fortune is reckoned high up in the millions.
