### Indians Not Dying Out.

"The Indian is by no means an extinct portion of civilization," ex-plained an Indian bureau official to a Star reporter, "as the coming census will clearly demonstrate. Indeed, instead of running out, the last ten years will show that he has got almost as good a hold on life as the most favored of our people. The poems regretting his passing away will have to be stored for some years. The Indian of late years has been generally engaged in minding his own business. The Indian is still in it, and will be in it for many years yet, and I would not be surprised if the coming census will show that there are over 300,000 of them."-Washington Star.
