Shubenacadie.

Prof. E. E. Faville, of the Horticultural College, Wolfville, delivered one of his interesting lectures last evening to a large and interested audience of ladies and gentlemen, in Temperance Hall, Shubenacadie. The able lecturer referred to wall sheets of illustrations and tables in the course of his talk on plant life and fruit culture. In his reply to a vote of thanks presented him by the chairman, Dr. McLean, he spoke on the superficialism yet so much existing in all pursuits, especially in Agriculture and Horticulture; and urged the sons of farmers to attend the Horticultural School, where there are systematic courses of investigation and instruction. He hoped that a local society would be organized through which distributing samples from the nursery and information may be given to the people. The farmers meet here every morning at the milk train hour, and words given in his interest are then taken in for discussion. Improved practical work follows.
