W. HEPBURN APPOINTED AS NEW MOVIE CENSOR

Victoria, Sept. 5.—The resignation of C. L. Gordon for the position of moving picture censor for British Columbia, which he has held since the formation of the office over four years ago, and the announcement that ex-Alderman Walter Hepburn, of Vancouver, had been appointed to immediately take over the office was announced this afternoon by Attorney-General Farris.

The matter arose through Hon. Mr. Farris advising Mr. Gordon that strong representations had been made to him (Mr. Farris), urging the passing of the film play "Damaged Goods" that had previously been rejected by Mr. Gordon, and suggesting to Mr. Gordon that he might, by cutting out certain parts of the play, reconsider his decision.

The attorney-general stated that a few days ago the matter of the picture was brought to his attention. At private showings of the film in Vancouver, Victoria and Revelstoke, a number of prominent professional men and clergy were present, including Dr. McLeish, of Revelstoke, Dr. McLean, minister of education for British Columbia, Archdeacon Heathcote and Rev. Mr. Huntley, of the First Baptist church Calgary, who is supplying in Vancouver and a number of ladies. Some of these ladies and gentlemen personally interviewed the attorney-general urging the passing of the picture, being unanimous in their claim that the picture should be shown in the public interest.

On the strength of these, the attorney-general wrote to Mr. Gordon informing him of the requests of these prominent people and suggesting that with the elimination of certain parts of the play Mr. Gordon might reasonably reconsider his decision.

CASSIAR IS FLOATED

The steamer Cassiar which went ashore recently on Privett Island, while bound from Kingcombe Inlet for Vancouver, has been raised by the British Columbia Salvage Company, of Victoria, the work having been carried out under the direction of Capt. F. C. Stratford, who left Victoria in command of the steamer Salvor for the scene of the wreck immediately following the mishap.

The Cassiar is owned by the Union Steamship Company, of British Columbia. The vessel will be taken to Vancouver for survey and repairs will probably be carried out at once. The steamer Cheakamus is at present looking after the Cassiar's run.

EDMONTON STRIKERS

Edmonton, Sept. 5.—The motor-men and conductors of the Municipal Railway, who went on strike Saturday to enforce a demand for a 20 per cent increase, met tonight and adopted a resolution to Mayor Henry stating that they are ready to return to work on the old basis of pay pending arbitration on a raise of 20 per cent. The resolution was submitted to the council. A number of cars were operated tonight, and Superintendent Moir says he has men enough to operate the whole system. The motors of a number of cars appeared to have been tampered with by some person with an expert knowledge of the machines.

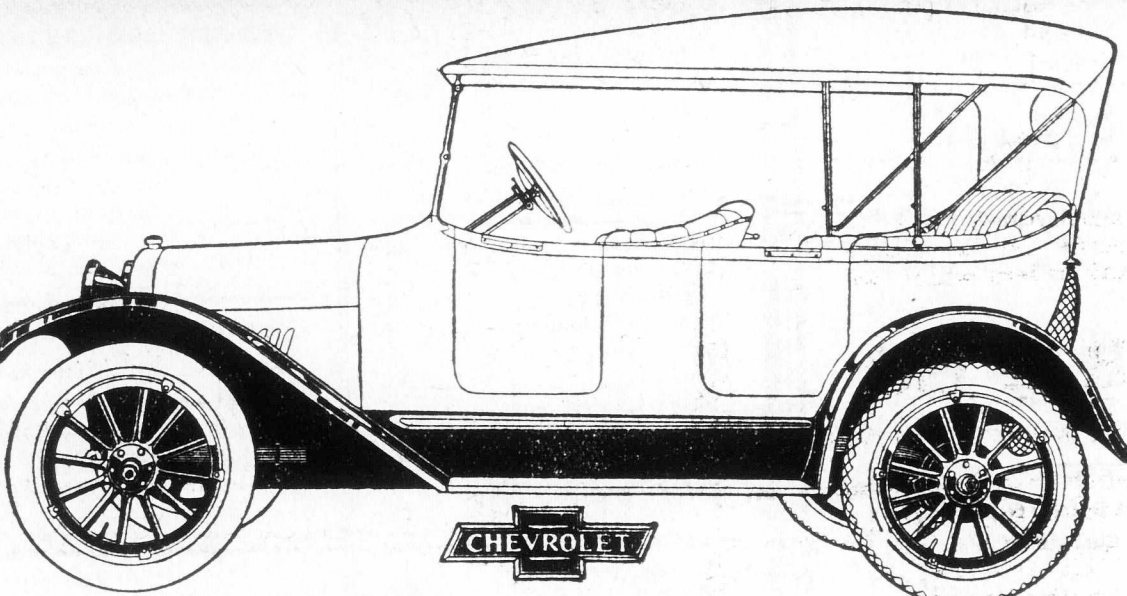
