ARATHON RACE AT SYNOTT THE OLYMPIC GAMES DEBAR MARATHON RACE AT

Excellent Course Over War-Torn Country Selected for

(Associated Press by Leased Wire.)
Antwerp, April 5.—The course for the Olympic Marathon race, the principal individual event of the Olympic Games, has been officially selected and promises an excellent test for the long distance runners of the world.

The start of the race, provisionally set for August 21 or 23, will be made from the Royal Palace at Laeken, just outside of Brussels, and the finish will be made in the Olympic Stadium at Antwerp. The distance will be 26.56 miles, including the final laps over-the Stadium track proper.

Leaving Laeken, the runners will follow a little used road from the Palace for a kilometre, making a detour which will bring them to the main highway between Brussels and Antwerp. 
