NATIONAL DEFENCE. To the Editor of the Times: Sir--In British prints, it is noticeable of late, much interest is taken by some in political circles as to national defence, naval and military, in event of any foreign invasion, which, as a matter of course, affects Empire interests. The two-nation navy standard has been maintained for years. But the military defence seems to be inadequate to meet such an emergency, even with all its volunteer and militia forces combined. The late demand for a million more men (ready to take the field), made by Lord Roberts, speaks plainly to the British public. He sees and knows the situation the Motherland would be in were an invasion to take place. He and others were, I remember, obliged to return home from Africa, after the Majuba Hill disaster, by order of the Gladstone Government. Lord Roberts said some time ago that had this disaster been retrieved at that time it would have availed the late Boer war. But in the interval, Kuller and other Transvaalers made full preparations to throw off British suzerainty, receiving encouragement, no doubt, from some European nations. A million more men to take arms in a moment's notice would speak of heavy taxation, in addition to the expense of a two-nation navy. All European nations except Britain have conscription armies, a plan which compels every male to undergo a military training. Lord Roberts sees that Britain is in a box as to its military equipment. A. yesterday, and entertained his hearers also with choice selections on the violin. Rev. Mr. Barton is a violinist of high order, and is a forceful speaker. His addresses were much enjoyed. Mohammed Ali, of Detroit, will be the speaker for next Sabbath. A score of Buffalo fishermen were carried out into Lake Erie on the shifting ice field. All were rescued but one.

DIPLOMAT INDANGER

People Threaten to Lynch Chancellor of German Legation.

Santiago, Chile, Feb. 13.--The feeling against Chancellor Beckert of the German Legation, who was arrested at Chillan on the charge of murdering a servant of the Legation and afterwards setting fire to the building to hide the crime, is intense in Santiago and fears are expressed that an attempt will be made to lynch him upon his arrival here. The police have taken steps to frustrate any such move on the part of the people. It is thought possible that Baron Von Bodeman, the German Minister, will exercise the right of sending Beckert to Germany for trial on the ground that the alleged crime was committed on German territory.

Japan Goes Abicycling.

Japan makes 40,000 to 50,000 bicycles yearly, and also imports 40,000, besides separate parts enough to make 50,000. The country now has 350,000 in use, mostly for business purposes. The demand for tires is 200 pairs daily, two-thirds of which are imported.
