SHOT PRISONER.

Leamington's Ex-Chief to be Tried For Manslaughter.

Chatham, Ont., May 4.—A change of tactics will be adopted by the Crown in the prosecution of Elliott J. Kimball, formerly chief of police at Leamington, who appears at the assizes opening here today to be tried a second time for shooting and killing an escaped prisoner last summer. Kimball was indicted on a charge of murder at the last assizes, but the jury disagreed, and he was released on bail. The Crown will now ask for conviction on a charge of manslaughter. William Heady, a travelling salesman, was wanted in Leamington on a charge of jumping a board bill, and Kimball went to arrest him on July 27 last at a Tilbury boarding house. Heady tried to escape over the back fence, and Kimball shot him through the back.

Many accidents have happened from the presence of too great a proportion of carbon monoxide in the illuminating gas at Washington, D. C., and now it is proposed to restrict the amount to 10 per cent. of the volume.

Two big vessels for use in the Pacific trade are now building at the Mitsubishi dockyards for the Orient Steamship Company. One is of 13,500 tons and two of 9,250 tons each.

The most powerful dredge in the world is claimed for Russia. It can move 7,000 cubic yards of earth from the bottom of a river in the course of dredging.

The Limerick Chamber of Commerce has approved of a resolution making Greenwich time the standard for the entire United Kingdom. At the present time Ireland is 24 minutes behind London.

The exportations of condensed milk from the United States have shown a very rapid growth in recent years, the value being in 1905, \$219,785; in 1908, \$671,670; in 1909, \$1,139,402; in 1905, \$2,156,616, and in 1908, \$2,455,186.

In its mercantile marine Japan has 1618 steamships, of 1,133,340 aggregate tonnage; 4,513 sailing vessels, of 37,319 aggregate tonnage, and 1,390 Japanese "ships of the old style," of 511,452 aggregate tonnage; in all, 7,523 ships, of 2,697,111 aggregate tonnage.

Battleship maintenance cost during the past year, found by averaging the cost of current repairs on seventeen United States battleships during 1908, amounts to \$110,000 per year per ship. This does not include the more extensive repairs or overhauling.

The operating cost of the Brooklyn Bridge is found to be as high as \$300,000 a year, according to an investigation made by the Comptroller of New York City. This figure is the average of 10 years' maintenance and operating costs, beginning with 1908.

Plans for the permanent illumination of Niagara Falls next summer have been worked out by Engineer Ryan, of the General Electric Company. The details will be laid before a committee of interested citizens from Niagara Falls, Ont., and Niagara Falls, N. Y. The plans as outlined by Mr. Ryan call for two batteries of lights, one to be known as the Cliff battery, the other as the gorge battery. It is planned to excavate a recess in the Canadian cliff opposite Goat Island, this shelf to be 125 feet long and 12 feet wide, the height of the excavation to be 10 feet. Here will be installed 20 projectors, each 20 inches in diameter. The Cliff battery will consist of 12 projectors, each 60 inches in diameter. These will also be placed in a recess which is to be 126 feet long, 12 feet high and 10 feet deep, the front to have the appearance of an ancient fortification. The previous illumination made during the progress of the exposition at Buffalo, was of 1,500,000 nominal candlepower, whereas the proposed illumination will be of 2,500,000 nominal candlepower.

SMUGGLED TRUNKS.

Four Persons Arrested in Connection With Their Seizure.

New York, May 4.—Four arrests were made to-day by United States Marshal Henkel on charges arising out of the seizure of smuggled trunks at this port about a year ago. The persons taken into custody were Geo. C. White, dealer in dressmakers' supplies, 45th street and 5th avenue; Lorne H. Walker, a former employee of the customs department; W. H. Kilgannon, former salesman for George F. Crowley, West 34th street, and Elizabeth Kilgannon, his wife. The four were arraigned before Judge Houghlin, the United States Circuit Court.

Ryan, of Chatham. The company is authorized, among other things, to acquire the oil and gas lands, etc., of the Holmes Syndicate and the Kamargo Oil Company. The share capital is \$1,000,000.
