Wilson, secretary of the Royal Colonial Institute, who had told him it was the first scheme of its kind to be presented to him.
Earl Grey also had endorsed it and Sir Max Aiken and Sir George Perley had displayed interest. Unfortunately the political upheaval in Great Britain had interrupted the successful prosecution of the scheme.

Fredericton, April 22—In the House today Hon Mr Baxter laid a charge that Hon Wm Currie, the speaker, did some time ago, as manager of the Continental Lumber Co, defraud Archibald Murchie, lumber scaler, to reduce the company's cut from 6,780,852 ft to 4,615,562 ft thereby defrauding the Government out of the stumpage on 2,165,290 ft. Murchie swears to this, and Mr Currie and Mr Richards deny the charge. A commission of five members is asked for with power to view all papers and examine witnesses under oath.

Fredericton, April 23—In the House today, he Mr Baxter moved an amendment that the minister in charge of the Health department be the provincial secretary.
This was defeated by a vote of 21 to 19.
