West Land Regulations

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the com. mencement of the present war, and who has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neut al'country, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, pplicant must appear in person at Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions Duties-Six months residence upon and cultivaion of land in each of three years

In certain districts a homesteader may secure an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption. Price \$3,00 per acre Duties-Reside six months in each o ree years after earning homestead atent and cultivate 50 xtercasre May obtain pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on certain con

A settler after obtaining homestead patent, if he cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.

Holders of entries may count time of employment as farm labourers in Canads during '1917, as residence duties under certain conditions,

When Dominion Lands are advertised or posted for entry, returned solderis who have served overseas and have been honourably discharged, receive one day priority in applying fo entry at local Agent's Office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge papers must be presented to Agent.
