Finishing up the Business of 1881.

FOURTH DAY.

Friday, Dec. 9th, 1881. The Council met pursuant to adjournment.—The Warden in the chair. All the members were present. The minutes of yesterday were read and approved. A number of accounts were presented.

A petition was presented from John Kruse. A communication was read from Mr. Esson.

Moved by Mr. McMillan, seconded by Mr. Girvin, that all correspondence respecting the non-fulfillment of their contract by the Hamilton Iron Bridge Co., be laid before this Council. Carried.

Correspondence, contract, etc., in reference to the Maitland Bridge was read and referred to the Road and Bridge committee.

The report of the Finance committee was read and adopted.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Weir, that this Council adjourn to meet at 3 p. m. Carried.

The Council resumed, the Warden in the chair. Report of the Equalization committee was read and adopted.

Report of the School and Printing Committee was read and adopted.

Moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. Hogarth, that the report of the School and Printing Committee be amended by allowing Mr. Miller to find a legally qualified substitute during this winter, subject to the approval of the Minister of Education. Lost on a division by a majority of two. The report was then adopted.

A communication was read from Mr. Sheppard, road and bridge commissioner, resigning his position, as he is about leaving for the North-West.

Moved by Mr. Hays, seconded by Mr. Clegg, that Mr. Sheppard's resignation be accepted, and that John Mason, Esq., Deputy Reeve of Hullett, be appointed road commissioner in his place. Carried.

A communication was read from D. McGillicuddy, claiming damages for injury to his buggy when crossing Manchester bridge. The claim was granted.

Report of Gaol and Court House committee was read and adopted.

Moved by Mr. Cook, seconded by Mr. Castle, that this Council do now adjourn, to meet to-morrow morning at eight o'clock. Carried.

FIFTH DAY.

Saturday, Dec. 10. The Council met pursuant to adjournment. The Warden in the chair. All the councillors were present. The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

Report of Road and Bridge committee was read and adopted.

Moved by Mr. Currie, seconded by Mr. Taylor, that a bylaw be passed to close the Bridge at Wingham known as Graham's bridge. Carried.

The report as amended was again submitted to the Council and adopted.

Moved by Mr. Castle, seconded by Mr. Castle, that the Clerk be instructed to correspond with the manager of the Waterloo House of Refuge, with the view of obtaining admittance into the institute of an orphan boy, by the name of Bartley, of the township of Stanley, who is indigent and insane. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Castle, seconded by Mr. Elliott, that the thanks of this Council be given to the proprietors of the Waterloo House of Refuge, for their kindness in supplying us with their valuable papers during the year. Carried.

By-law No. 9, 1881, confirming By-law No. 16, of the township of Colborne for sale of road allowance, was read and passed.

By-law No. 10, 1881, licensing hawkers and peddlers was read and passed.

By-law No. 11, 1881, appointing a road commissioner was read and passed.

Moved by Mr. Gibson, seconded by Mr. Castle, that this Council do now adjourn, to meet to-morrow morning at eight o'clock. Carried.

REPORTS.

REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE.—The following accounts audited matters having been referred to committee, we recommend as follows:—

John Hyslop's account, asking that this Council allow him \$500 on account of work done on contract of building Maitland bridge, leaving a balance, according to Hyslop's statement, of \$200. From explanations it appears that the payment of the sum of \$500 would leave a balance of only \$100 to finish the contract. Hence your committee recommend that only \$200 be paid Mr. Hyslop on account of said contract, and that all material now on the ground, is to be used only for the construction of said bridge, and is now the property of this Council.

The treasurer having submitted to your committee, mortgage (1) \$4,800 on 250 acres; (2) \$1,100 on 75 acres; (3) \$2,200 on 100 acres; (4) \$2,900 on 100 acres; (5) \$1,800 on 110 acres; (6) \$1,200 on 100 acres; and (7) \$2,720 on 150 acres amounting to \$17,820, together with Mr. J. T. Garrow's certificates of the titles of the lands which loans have been made, we find that each of the loans have been made, in accordance with the Statute.

On J. Brotherhood's correspondence, we recommend that the thanks of this Council be tendered Mr. Brotherhood for the interest he has taken in directing the attention of this Council to the dangerous condition of the Maitland bridge, and hereby possibly preventing a serious accident, and that he be granted the sum of \$15 as remuneration for his services rendered to this Council.
