

SHOT THROUGH THE HEAD. A Central Prison Convict Shot and Instant ly Killed While Attempting to Make His [Escare. - His Companion Makes His Escape.

of the city that a terrible tragedy had occurred at the Central Prison, the exact nature of which was, however, not known. Information was at length rcceived at No. 3 Police Station that a convict in the Central Prison named Scott was shot dead late in the afternoon by one of the prison guards while in the act of attempting to escape. Soon after his ordination ... was appointed first assistant in the opis copalian Church at St. Thomas : from there he was removed to Port Dover to take charge of St. Paul's Church in that town. In 1868 he was appyinted to the rectorship of St. Luke's Church, Mon-treal, which he held till the year 1872. He then became assistant at Christ Church Cathedral. In 1871 he received his ordination as canon, and in the following year was appointed to the rector ship of Christ Church Cathedral, which position he has filled for eleven years. He stands high in the esteem of the peo ple of Montreal, and holds a warm place in the hearts of churchmen in that city. Last year he was ordained a dean, and by Friday's vote attained the enviable ecclesiastical eminence-Bishop of Hu
