#### APPROVE OF READING.

LONDON, Jan. 13. The entire press of India including that of the Nationalists, warmly welcomed the appointment of Lord Reading as Viceroy of India, says a despatch from India. The newspapers editorially express confidence that Lord Reading will succeed in bringing peace and prosperity to the country.

#### POLICE AMBUSHED--TWO KILLED.

LIMERICK, Jan. 13. A number of members of constabulary from Ennis were ambushed today near Cratloe, County Clare. A volley was fired into their lorry from both sides of the road. A sergeant and one constable were killed. The attacking party escaped.

#### BRITAIN PROTESTS.

ATHENS, Jan. 13. The British Minister, Lord Granville, has entered a protest with the Greek Government over the action of certain sections of the Greek press in printing editorials condoning the attempt to assassinate Venizelos, made by two Greek officers in Paris last August when the Premier was attending to peace adjustment matters in that city. The articles in question urged the Greek nation to stand behind the accused men and endeavor to obtain their acquittal, as however indefensible political assassinations might be, those officers it argued, represented the Greek nation and felt they were ridding the country of a tyrant. The editorials added that proofs should be given the French why which is to try the officers showed alleged tyrannical character of the former Premier as justifying the shooting.

#### WINS IN 17TH ROUND.

LONDON, Jan. 13. Pete Horman, United States Bantamweight, won over Jimmie Wilde here to-night. The referee stopped the battle and awarded the decision to Horman in the seventeenth round.

#### MORE REPRISALS REPORTED.

BELFAST, Jan. 13. It is reported that incendiary fires have occurred at Dungloe and Burtport, in reprisal for ambushing of a troop train yesterday in Donegal. No direct confirmation of the report has been received as telegraph wires have been cut.

#### FRENCH SENATE RECONVENES.

PARIS, Jan. 13. The Senate reconvened today for its first session following the recent elections and proceeded to organize by re-electing Leon Bourgeois as its President. M. Bourgeois received two hundred and twenty votes as against seventeen for other candidates.

#### JAPAN EXPRESSED REGRET.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13. Lieut. W. H. Langdon, of the United States cruiser Albany, was shot by a Japanese sentry at Vladivostok when he failed to understand or heed the command to halt, said an official version of the incident received today by the Japanese Embassy from its Government. Lieut. Langdon, the message said, had drawn a revolver after the sentry had pulled back the hood that covered his face in an effort to determine his nationality, but did not fire until after the sentry had shot him after the officer had turned to walk away. Another message to the Embassy said the Japanese Government and people were greatly concerned over the incident, and that both the Minister of War at Tokio and Japanese commandant at Vladivostok has expressed regret to the Commander of the Albany, of which Lieut. Langdon was Chief Engineer.

#### MONTREAL UNEMPLOYED DISSATISFIED.

MONTREAL, Jan. 13. Vehement dissatisfaction with the results so far shown by the Citizens Unemployment Committee at the City Hall is expressed by both officials and workless men of the Unemployed Ex-Service Men's Association. Indeed, so keenly do the workless men feel about a statement published yesterday that officials of the Great War Veterans' Association are satisfied that the city is now doing its best to help the unemployed that at meetings held last night and this morning officials of the Ex-Service Association had great difficulty in restraining their men from going to break up things at the City Hall. J. T. Thompson, Vice President of the Ex-Service Men's Association said this morning we have stopped sending our men to the Citizens Unemployment Committee because we find it is a waste of time. Nothing whatever is done.

### Sherlock Holmes Superseded.

A few years ago the idol of the reading public, or at least that section of it which was given to the detective style of literature, was Sherlock Holmes. To-day Sherlock Holmes has been put on the shelf and Malcolm Sage has taken his place. The author of *Blindie* appears in a new light in some of his recent works. In "John Dene of Toronto" he has given to the public Malcolm Sage and now that detective achieves fame in a volume all to himself. "Malcolm Sage-Detective" (Jenkins 7-8). This work is by the author-publisher--Mr. Herbert Jenkins himself--the creator of the greatest Cockney since Sam Weller--Blindie. The book consists of an absorbing series of yarns in which humour is linked with tragedy in a style peculiar to H. J. Its reception across the Atlantic sets a notable example to us on our side. Sage with his office staff, Miss Gladys Norman (Secretary) Thompson (Assistant) and William Johnson (junior) will amuse and instruct.

### A Modern Book.

The sages of to-day are fond of averring that the modern type of book is light and frivolous and has nothing to it. This is not so. The modern book to suit these troublous times has to be light and airy on the surface but nevertheless it combines solid instruction with whole-hearted enjoyment. Such a book is "Patricia Brent-Splinter" (Jenkins 2-8). Though it appears to be light the theme is one which is powerful in its deep magnetism. Once you pick up the book, you don't readily lay it down. The amusing adventures of the heroine a "guest" at a London boarding-house, surrounded by other guests who are feline to the highest degree she launches into a "make-believe" engagement for 'one night only' with Col. Lord Peter Bowen. The latter conscious of the charms of Patricia is loath to drop the matter and remains engaged to Patricia. The other characters, Lady Tamara, (Lord Peter's sister) Miss Brent, (Patricia's sole surviving relative) Mr. Triggs and Godfrey Elton make the book a complete success.
