Dr. Ouimet Acquitted.

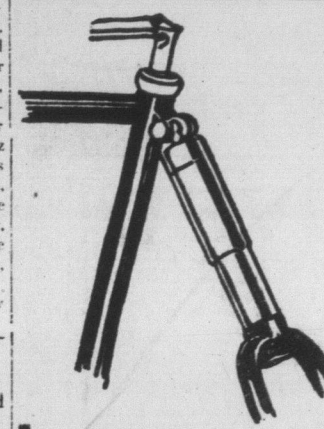
Ottawa, June 30.—Dr. J. A. Ouimet of Hull, arrested in Ottawa on June 7, on a charge of murder, was given his freedom yesterday morning in Hull Police Court by Magistrate Goyette. He was accused of having caused the death of Mrs. Frank Spain by a criminal operation. The preliminary hearing ended on Monday, but judgment was reserved until yesterday.
