The schooner C. E. Ward, a little ves sel thirty feet long and of nine feet beam, put into Plumper Pass a short time ago and lay there for ten days. Aboard were her skipper and owner, Jacob Leonabey, and one man whose name is not known.
The Ward was laden with tombstones
for Westminster, but as the men aboard
did not know the way to the Fraser well

then returned.
Constable Drummond went aboard and found that the men had only a couple of found that the men had only a couple of old charts to guide them so he warned them that if they were caught in a blow it was likely that they would come to grief. This was on November 26.

The schooner was seen again at Plumper Pass on November 30, after an unsuccessful attempt to reach the Fraser. She lay at the Pass until December 4 and nothing more was seen of her until
