
Militant Suffragettes Make Dash for Royal Carriage Outside London Theatre

The women, who had gathered in considerable numbers, made a dash for the royal carriage, on its arrival at the theatre, shouting "women are being tortured in prison." nen are being tortured in prison.

They had almost reached the carriage when the police closed around, and, with defiant shouts of "votes for women," were hurled back. The suffragettes were treated roughly by the crowd, but managed to escape
