**GRIST MILLS**  
It will be gratifying to the farmers and all those interested in the well-being of the community to know that grist mills throughout the province is an acknowledged possibility. It is understood that legislation has been introduced whereby flour mills can be established in the various districts and fulfilling certain conditions will receive a bonus from the Provincial Government. The amount of the bonus has not been fixed, but it is known that the Minister for Agriculture is intensely interested in this matter, and it is felt that grants in favor of establishing such mills can no longer be delayed.

The Hon. J. A. Murray, Minister of Agriculture has been over all the ground in the province and the matter is receiving his whole-hearted support. It is now therefore up to the farmers and those interested to make their requests known and the proper machinery will be set in motion.

The establishment of such grist mills in Rural districts and small communities would mean much, and would encourage the growing of wheat, in this province, a commodity we cannot have enough of at this time.

It would also affect every one in the district as the farmer could have his own wheat milled, at his own home, one might say, and be able to sell his surplus flour, at a little cheaper price than \$9 a barrel.
