At the last session of Parliament the Montreal bucket shop men were represented in the lobby by Mr. "Bob" McGibbon, an energetic young Q. C. of the City on the St. Lawrence, who used all his leval acumen and ingenaity to thwart Senator Abbott's bill; but, alsa, to no purpose. Mr. "Bob's" principal haunt was the restaurant of the House of Commons, where, over liberal replenishers of "fizz" and whisky and apollouaris he was wont to calole the urban and suburban member into woting down the bulk which was to deal a death-blow to the bucket shops. The hope was deeply cherished that the House of Commons would throwitous—but it didn't. Mr. McGibbon did not bother with the senators very much, as he thought the best field for his balents was among the commoners. And besides, the computent Senator Oxidvie was doing Mr. "Bob" McGibbon Works the Lobby.

The only action that seems to have been taken in Montreal to enforce the bill was a resolution passed by the Police Committee the other day, which instructed the Chief of Police to "suppress all kind of gambling—dice in saloous, ands and the bucket shop." It was mentioned at the committee meeting that To-conts was "investigating a bucket shop case," and the members expressed themselves as containing a wall, the outcome of its. They now
