THE TREATY WITH THE CAPE

NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THE TWO GOVERNMENTS PROGRESSING.

The Newfoundland Conference Expects to Close To-Day, After Which the Speech from the Throne Will Be Drafted-Col. Otter's Appointment Deemed Im-

Ottawa, April 12.-During the past few days communications have been pass ing between the Governments of Canada and Cape Colony, in reference to a commeacement of negotiations for a trade treaty between the two countries. In response to an inquiry from Right Hon. Cecil Rhodes, Cape Premier, as to a con-venient meeting place, Sir Mackenzie Bowell said that either Ottawa or London would be acceptable to the Dominion Government. In official circles here, however, it is not expected that any-

To Braft the Speech from the Throne. As soon as the negotiations with the Newfoundland delegates are concluded, which will probably be to-morrow, the ministers will proceed to draft the Speech from the Throne. Each minister is asked to indicate what subjects relating to his department, in his opinion, are sufficiently important to justify mention in the speech. It is generally understood here that the Newfoundland negotiations and the action of the Government on the Manitoba school question will be the two principal topics referred to.
