tance to an interested player. I tell this because I was told as a fact-from a non-player, of course ably accurate, and she knows -that nine miles were nothing to a golf lover.

An ordinary golf link covers of the game. about three miles—that is, taking a direct course; but when you have to follow your ball wherever it may drop, you add another four or six miles to the number mentioned. A good player ought to put his ball within a few feet of the spot he aims at, but a beginner never knows where it will pitch. The least pull on the club will bring it around to the right or left, and this has to be understood, and the right club used, as the case may need. Much depends on the way the club is gripped and the way he or she stands when playing.

A match on the 1st of July is likely to be arranged between the Torontos and the Rosedales, at the Fern Hill grounds.

A golf course has been laid out at High Park, north of Howard Lake, and several games have been played already. It is to be a public place; any club being allowed to play on it. 


