A NOTABLE INTERVIEW WITH POPE LEO.

The London News says - The audience which the Pope accorded on Saturday morning to Lord Brampton (Sir Henry Hawkins) and Lady Brampton, was a most interesting event.

Monignor Merry del Val, son of the Spanish Ambassador to the Holy See, and the gentleman who was Papal delegate in Canada on the Manitoba Schools question, advanced to meet them.

After this Lord Brampton was on the Pope's right and her ladyship on the left, kneeling, while Cardinal Vaughan was opposite.

The impression which the visitors received they describe as indelible. They had seen the Pope on the previous Sunday at St. Peter's, and then thought him very weak and frail.

Her ladyship went on to describe the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, which his Holiness sat, and which was a real work of art.

The Pontiff began to speak in French, exclaiming: "Oh I I love England, dear England," and then went on to recall his visit to London and his audience of Queen Victoria.

The Pope several times repeated what seemed to be a favourite expression with him - "How I love Great Britain, that great nation!" He also spoke about his Jubilee year and the Bull which he is preparing on the subject.

We must confess that at times it seemed an utter impossibility to get those thousands of grain shovellers, who had sworn that they would rather die than ever again tolerate even the semblance of Connerism, to consider calmly the substantial victory that Bishop Quigley had obtained for them.

For all this, after God, the honour and glory belong to Bishop Quigley. It is a great victory which he has gained for his people. It was because of them, that he entered into the fight. He knew the wrongs they had suffered so long at the hand of ruthless robbery, insolence, and brutality; and he longed for the day in which he could wipe out those wrongs and emancipate his people.

For this stupendous public service which, so far as we recall, is unparalleled in the history of episcopal achievement in the republic, God be praised and Bishop Quigley be thanked. His people are now prouder of him than ever, and the entire community is grateful for what he has done.

THAT CORONATION OATH

The following resolution was passed unanimously by Branch No. 1 of C. M. E. A., Ottawa: - Resolved that whereas this branch having received from St. Joseph's Branch of the Catholic Truth Society, of this city, a communication accompanied by a pamphlet, containing a copy of a resolution passed at a public meeting held in Ottawa, having for its object the removal of certain obnoxious and offensive features in the declaration accompanying the coronation oath of the British sovereign, which was declared to be in substance as follows: - "That the doctrine of transubstantiation, the Sacrifice of the Mass, and other doctrines of the Roman Catholic Church are branded as superstitions and idolatrous."

Resolved that this branch does heartily endorse the movement and rests secure in the hope that the broad spirit of toleration, which characterizes the British Parliament and people, and which within the reign of our present gracious sovereign, has led to the repeal of the declaration in question in so far as members of Parliament, peers of the realm, and office holders are concerned, will induce them to give their earnest support for its further repeal, in so far as it applies to the supreme head of the State. That we fully believe that the removal of said declaration would enable the Roman Catholics of the Empire to enter into the ceremony of their sovereign's coronation, with an enlarged spirit of loyalty and affection, and conduce towards that mutual esteem which should ever subsist between a free people and their sovereign.

Resolved that copies of this resolution be sent to our Parliamentary representatives, and to the press for publication.
