Mr. Hays: For some time now anyone who had great problems, or to whom disasters happened, could make representations to the Farm Credit Corporation which has given them a holiday on their payments. This is still going on.

Mr. Ricard: As a supplementary question, is it also true that in order to obtain such holidays as the minister mentions it is obligatory to have a letter of introduction from the Minister of Forestry (Mr. Sauvé)?

Mr. Hays: No, that is not so. That is not correct. This is something that is done all over Canada.

Mr. Drury: Mr. Speaker, this is a continuing program and what is now under discussion are projections of the future of this program. Projects over present limits are under consideration by the government in Ottawa, in consultation with the other participant in the program, the United States.
