Hon. Robert K. Andras (Minister of Manpower and Immigration): 1. Yes but these data are maintained by district office rather than region to enable the Commission's local offices to provide a more effective service to UIC claimants as distinct from the concerned citizen at large. This information is used for adjudication purposes and to assist claimants in meeting their obligation to seek and find work. However, in the filling of specific job vacancies, claimants are sent by the Unemployment Insurance Commission to Canada Manpower Centres which with their job banks and counselling services, have the responsibility of referring individuals to specific employers.
